 Prime Minister SUGA pledged a policy statement, "Carbon Neutrality by 2050" in October 2020:
 "Japan is committed to achieving carbon neutrality by 2050."

- Whole markets in the world will be affected through global supply chain.


JOINT CREDITING MECHANISM (JCM)

- Halve the proportion of people whose income is less than \$1.25 a day
- Halve the proportion of people who suffer from hunger



Goal 2: Achieve universal primary

Ensure that children everywhere, boys and girls alike, will be able to complete a full course of primary schooling



Goal 3: Promotegender equality and empowerwomen

· Eliminate gender disparity in all levels of education



Goal 4: Reduce child mortality

· Reduce by two thirds the under-five Logos created 財政 NIPの を bal Callto Action Against Poverty.



Goal 5: Improve maternal health

Reduce by three quarters the maternal



Goal 6: Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases

Have halted and begun to reverse the spread of HIV/AIDS



Goal 7: Ensure environmental sustainability


Halve the proportion of the population without sustainable access to safe drinking water and basic sanitation






SDGs Future Cities




- Local governments' initiatives to achieve SDGs will contribute to local revitalization.

SDGs for Local Revitalization Public-Private Partnership Platform








