

The Japan Biodiversity Fund (JBF) was established by the Government of Japan to support developing countries in implementing the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 and its Aichi Biodiversity Targets, adopted at COP10 in Nagoya, Japan.











The JBF has facilitated, funded, and supported a wide array of activities, implemented by the Secretariat of the Convention and by external partners, including technical support for NBSAP* development, revision, and implementation.

The second phase of the JBF was launched in December 2022 at COP15, with emphasis on bridging the gap between the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 and the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF).

The second phase of the fund will support developing country Parties to:

- Implement the Kunming-Montreal GBF
- Update and implement their NBSAPs in relation to the Kunming-Montreal GBF
- Strengthen their overall capacity to implement the Convention and its Protocols











The Secretariat is convening a series of regional and sub-regional dialogues to support the implementation of decisions adopted at COP15.
