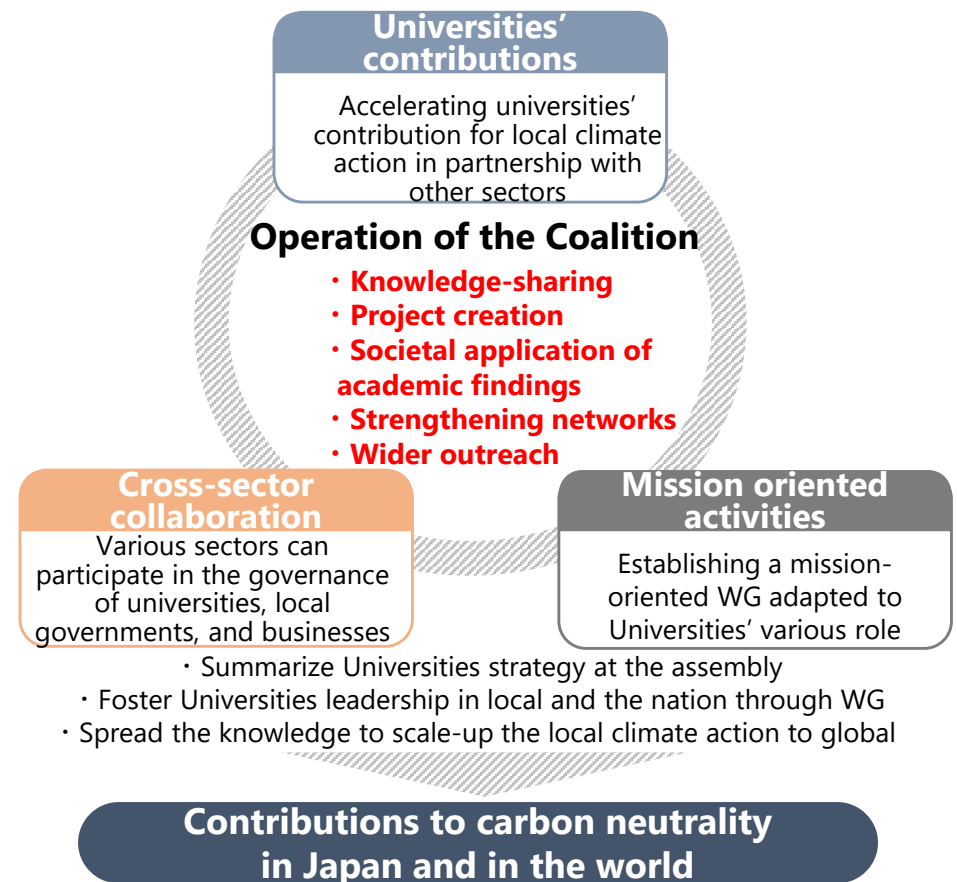
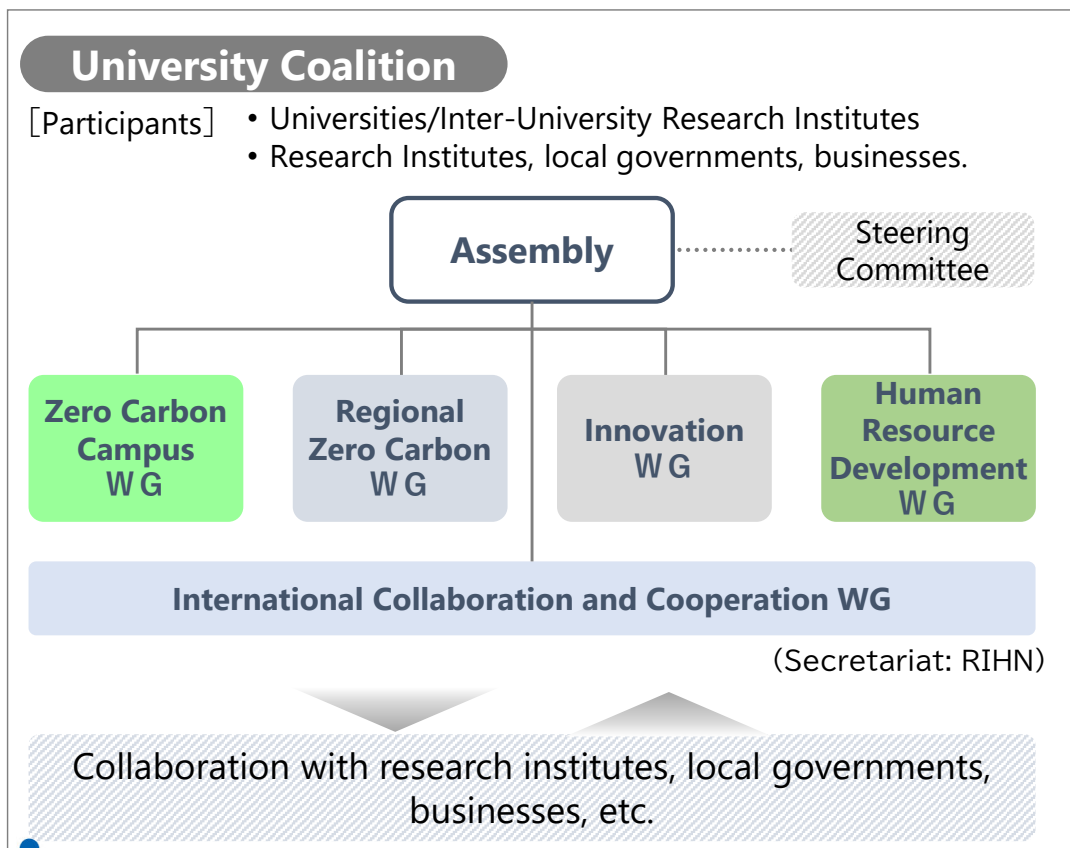


University Coalition for Carbon Neutrality

In order to achieve carbon neutrality, which has been the subject of rapidly growing discussion both in Japan and abroad in recent years, it is necessary for all actors, including the national government, local governments, universities, and businesses, to work together in accordance with their respective positions and strengths. From this perspective, under the leadership of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI), and the Ministry of the Environment (MOE), the **“University Coalition for Carbon Neutrality”** was launched on July 29, 2021.



About Five Working Groups

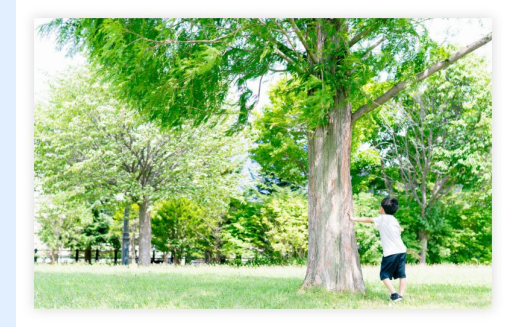
Zero Carbon Campus WG
