







## Collaborating Event: Circular Economy in the Sultanate of Oman and Japan

*Oman Vision 2040* sets out the future direction that guides the country to a sustainable society. It also encourages collaboration among different sectors from governments to private sector. Among others, waste treatment is identified as one of the most challenging issues in Oman and where Japan is able to share its technical knowledge and practical experiences in association with circular economy.

As an outstanding milestone of cooperation between Oman and Japan, six officials are visiting to Japan for several weeks to learn waste management and circular economy practices undertaken in Japan. Celebrating the collaboration, this event is co-organized by the Embassy of Oman in Japan, the Ministry of the Environment, Japan and EX Research Institute for better mutual understanding between two countries and for networking among people concerned.
